Our Stars Over Newberry and Backcountry Film Festival fundraisers raised a combined \$25,000 for conservation education programs and our new membership program continues to grow.

## **EDUCATION & INTERPRETATION**

We are excited to announce that we have increased our Education Staff from one to three. This will allow us to better serve our students, visitors and partners with conservation education and interpretive services. ## **EVERY KID IN A PARK**

Working with our Forest Service partners, we introduced 4th grade students across Oregon to public lands right in their backyards. Newberry National Volcanic Monument hosted 1,700 fourth grade students in 2016. Participants in the program received the Every Kid in a Park annual pass, providing free access to federal lands and waters for 4th graders and their guests.

## **VOLUNTEERS**

Volunteers contributed thousands of hours of service on both Deschutes and Ochoco National Forests and Crooked River National Grasslands, surpassing 2015's record breaking numbers by 8,000 hours! Volunteers built shelters, led naturalist hikes, introduced public lands to thousands of Central Oregon students, managed rangeland projects, surveyed wildlife, pulled invasive weeds, repopulated milkweed to save endangered monarch butterflies, educated people on Wilderness ethics and Leave No Trace, and much more! Volunteers also improved their skills and knowledge participating in Discover Your Forest hosted trainings, lectures, and field trips during the year. Over 115 volunteers were honored with the Presidential Volunteer Service Award and Forest Service Chief's Award.






## **VISITOR SERVICES**


## **RETAIL SUPPORT**


